<b>Child Care Worker</b>	21,110	Varies by state. Ranges from less than high school to an associate's degree in Early Childhood Education.	All states require centers to be licensed via <a href="#">the state's child care licensing agency</a> . State requirements for workers in licensed centers range from less than high school to a college degree. There are 2 national credentials. <a href="#">1) Child Development Associate (CDA) from the Council for Professional Recognition</a> and <a href="#">2) Child Care Professional from the National Child Care Association</a> .
<b>Instructional Aides/Teacher Assistants</b>	24,880	Associate's Degree or Certificate	No licensure requirements.
<b>Librarian Assistant / Technician</b>	25,120 – 31,410	Associate Degree or Certificate	No licensure requirements.
<b>Preschool teacher</b>	29,200	Varies by state. Ranges from less than high school to an associate's degree in Early Childhood Education.	Varies by state. These requirements range from high school diploma and a national <a href="#">Child Development Associate</a> credential to an associate's degree in Early Childhood Education and licensure by <a href="#">the state's education agency</a> .
<b>Kindergarten / Elementary /# Middle / Secondary School Teachers*</b>	K – 51,550; Elem - 54,330; Middle – 54,880; Sec. – 55,990	Bachelor's Degree	All states require licensure. Requirements vary by state. Specific requirements can be accessed via <a href="#">each state's education agency</a> .
<b>Special Education Teachers</b>	55,200- 58,080	Bachelor's Degree	All states require licensure. Requirements vary by state. Specific requirements can be accessed via <a href="#">each state's education agency</a> .

<b>ESL/ESOL Teachers</b>	51,080	Bachelor's Degree	Licensure may be required if employed in a State or local government run program. Licensing agency would be the <a href="#">state's education agency</a>
<b>Instructional Coordinators</b>	61,270	Master's Degree or higher (usually in education)	All states require licensure. Requirements vary by state. Specific requirements can be accessed via <a href="#">each state's education agency.</a>
<b>Educational/Vocational/School Counselors</b>	55,970	Master's Degree or higher	All states require licensure. Requirements vary by state. Specific requirements can be accessed via <a href="#">each state's education agency.</a>
<b>Librarians</b>	58,720	Master's Degree	All states require licensure. Requirements vary by state. Specific requirements can be accessed via <a href="#">each state's education agency.</a>
<b>Education Administrators (includes Pre-School to Post-Secondary Administrators)</b>	50,410 - 96,680	Master's Degree (or higher) in Education Administration or Educational Leadership	All states require licensure. Requirements vary by state. Specific requirements can be accessed via <a href="#">each state's education agency.</a>

\*It should be noted that almost all 50 states have instituted alternative routes to licensure so that interested parties may not need to complete a Bachelor's Degree in Education specifically.

\*\*With the proper amount of work experience in the chosen teaching field, many states allow Vocational Education teachers to enter the field with a bachelor's degree minus the teacher preparation program or with only a high school diploma.
